The Global Land Challenges

Global Challenges

- o **Climate change**
- o **Rapid urbanization**
- o **Increased demand for natural resources**
- o **Food, water and energy insecurity**
- o **Natural disasters and violent conflicts.**

These challenges have a clear LAND dimension!

Land is increasingly recognized as an important governance issue.



THE GLOBAL URBAN CHALLENGES

- By 2050 5.3 billion urban people in developing world
- The slum dweller population is estimated to be 1.2 billion
- Urban growth in developing world equates slum growth
- Sub Saharan Africa: 62% of cities are slums
- Southern Asia: 43% of cities are slums
- By 2030 global cities will have expanded by 175% in terms of ecological footprint



THE GLOBAL LAND CHALLENGES

- **Only 30 % cadastral coverage** (versus 70% tenures off register) – *Need to secure tenure ASAP to all citizens.*
- **Only 2-3% ownership by women** – *how to increase?*
- Dealing with the **affordability issue**: *how to modernise systems in a pro-poor way?*
- **Complexity of land rights, claims, and records**: Need to have new forms of land administration and records systems.

Key Challenge for Land Administrators and Professionals

*How to support **various tenure types & systems** to enable land reform and secure land and property rights for all?*

Core Values:


Pro-poor, governance, equity, subsidiarity, affordability, systematic large scale approach, gender sensitiveness and sustainability.



GLTN OBJECTIVES

- Establish a **continuum of land rights** rather just focus on individual land titling;
- Improve and develop **pro-poor** land management as well as land tenure tools;
- Unblock existing land initiatives;
- Improve **global coordination** on land (Paris Declaration);
- Assist in the development of **gender-sensitive** tools
- Improve the dissemination of **knowledge** about how to improve security of tenure at scale
- Develop pro-poor and gender appropriate land tools (18 tools)

CONTINUUM OF LAND RIGHTS



INNOVATIVE LAND TENURE AND ADMINISTRATION

- UN-HABITAT Governing Council resolution
- Land governance initiatives (e.g. WB LGAF)
- FAO-led Voluntary Guidelines
- Regional initiatives: AU Land Policy Initiative, Land Policy Review Process in the Eastern Caribbean States

The Paradigm Shift:

- Secure land and property rights for all
- Recognition of **plurality of tenure systems** and required **alternative forms of land administration and land records**




SAMPLE TOOLS

STDM and Pro-Poor Land Recordation

- Alternative forms of land administration and records systems
- Address issues with conventional systems
- Promotes equity, participation, transparency, efficiency, sustainability and **affordability**
- Can be implemented with other pro-poor land tools (e.g. enumeration, co-management, post crisis, gender, grassroots, etc.)
- Huge potential to provide secure tenure for all **AT SCALE!**



WHAT IS STDM?



INITIAL DESIGN OF PRO-POOR LAND RECORDATION SYSTEM

- Complete data is not the first goal; Creation of strong evidence not the primary task
- Affordable; equitable process
- For preventive justice (e.g. Latin notary)
- Certainty embedded in social structures
- Improve land governance
- Co-management approach
- Management of power relations
- Barefoot land officer; Records keeper from the community
